




Division D hosted two successful viewing events to watch the contestants of the 2018 World Championship of Public Speaking.

Timeline:

- Call for Candidates published Oct. 8, 2018.
- Candidates declare and submit paperwork by Dec. 15, 2018.
- Interviews take place in December 2018 and January 2019
- District Leadership (Nominating) Committee notifies District Director of nominated candidates by March 1, 2019 (six weeks before election).
- District Leadership (Nominating) Committee publishes nominations on District website by March 1, 2019.

Floor candidates may declare their intent to run after the committee results have been announced.


