

If you want to contribute to the lives of incarcerated individuals, I can think of no better way than to become a Toastmasters volunteer for a prison club. If you have an interest in spreading the opportunities for self-improvement that the Toastmasters Pathways program provides, consider volunteering to attend meetings of one of the many prison clubs in District 9. Early in the month, Gaveliers' members and guests gathered to celebrate 80 years as a Toastmasters club. There was a catered dinner and presentations on the history of the club by Dick Jensen and Dick Leland. Newer member John Bruce gave a great speech on why he joined Toastmasters. The youngest attendee of the celebration was 9 years old, the son of the club president, and the club honored the oldest member of the club, aged 96, who recently passed. As a memorial to Father Ted, the club dedicated its lectern to him. Father Ted was a regular contributor to the club and the plaque on the lectern commemorates his contributions.



Club officer training for 2022-2023 has officially ended. We will start the first round of training for the 2023-2024 officers in mid-June. Be thinking about what office you might want to experience if you're new to Toastmasters. It is a learning workshop and taking on an officer role is a fabulous way to gain leadership experience in a safe and supportive environment. If you want to know more about the officer roles talk with your current club officers. If you're currently an officer, start thinking about whom you want to recruit to take your place next year. Each club will want to have the 2023-2024 officers elected early in June. And if you've been a club officer and want to try your hand at leadership at the district level, talk to your Area Director. Those Toastmasters are thinking about who might fill that role next year. It's a great opportunity to expand your experience and gain some new skills.

Club Growth Director Report

We are rapidly coming to the end of the membership renewal cycle. March 31 is the deadline for renewals to be processed. A new feature has been added to the TI website called Self Pay. This allows individual members to make payments directly to TI on the website instead of having to rely on the Treasurer to make those for you. In order to do this your club must vote to allow Self Pay, however the old traditional method is still available if you so choose. As of March 24, 2023, the district still needed about 170 renewals to meet the minimum goal.

Also, March 31 is the deadline to renew closed clubs under the incentive program which allows for previously closed clubs to renew with only 12 members instead of the normal charter number of 20. We have a number of those in this district so I encourage all Division Directors and Area Directors to contact those clubs to see if they can restart.



As I have stated before, each of us is a member of the membership team. Those people you know won't become members of this Leadership Group if you don't ask, so ask, ask, ask. Until next time.

Keynote Speaker Linda-Marie Miller



2020 Runner-Up to World Champion of Public Speaking Will Keynote Conference

Linda-Marie Miller, who placed second in the 2020 World Championship of Public Speaking and was a finalist in the 2022 contest, will keynote District 9's 2023 Conference, delivering on Sat. April 29 an address entitled "Challenges as Opportunities: Embracing the Journey to Success."

You will leave this keynote committed to standing up and stepping into the amazing future that is waiting for you alone! Then we'll all get to see you rise to the challenge and fly!!!



Linda-Marie is an International Professional Speaker, Certified Experiential Trainer and International Coaching Federation (ICF) Certified Coach and author. As a Toastmaster, Linda-Marie has ascended to the final stage at the World Championship of Public Speaking every time she has competed.

Linda-Marie will also present a workshop at the conference, "Your Life is Your Message." Here's how she describes it: One of the things I get asked a lot is, "Wow, Linda-Marie...you have so many amazing stories! Where do you get all these stories?" My motto is this: Life is Just a Speech in the Making. When you are open to seeing your life differently, you can begin to start digging out the golden stories that are in you. SMED-Talk Speakers

Natalie Palmer Returns to D9 as SMED-Talk Speaker

Natalie Palmer, District 9 Governor in 2014-2015, is the final SMED-Talk speaker to be revealed for the 2023 Conference, with her presentation, "The Heart of the Matter: Building Connection in your Club."

Here's how Natalie describes her talk, which she will deliver on Saturday, April 29: Have you ever sat in a room full of people, but still felt completely alone? One of the keys to membership in a group, whether Toastmasters or another group, is feeling like we matter. While they may be small ideas, they have big impacts. Join us as we talk about the things that make us feel like we belong, and the steps we can take to bring together our clubs and the people who make up our world.





Natalie's talk will provide concrete steps and concepts based on research around "Mattering vs. Marginalization" and tied to Toastmaster's Moments of Truth assessment. She will discuss the five concepts of mattering and provide concepts that can be applied immediately to benefit the club membership.

Natalie Palmer, DTM, PRA, PDG, lives in Denver, Colorado, and is a second-generation Toastmaster, joining Wenatchee's Cascade Speakeasy Club in 2008.



Jacob Liston to Address Loneliness in SMED Talk, 'Scrolling Alone'

Twenty-two years ago, Robert Putnam wrote Bowling Alone, one of the most significant books in social science. Putnam detailed the decline of social capital in America over the past 50 years and how this decline affects civic engagement and our democracy. Much has changed since the new millennium. Jacob Liston, member of Tri Cities Toastmasters, will discuss in his SMED Talk "Scrolling Alone" Putnam's thesis in a modern-day context, with a heavy focus on social media, the current loneliness crisis, and polarization. Jacob will deliver his talk on Sat., April 29.

"I will discuss my own struggles with loneliness," Jacob says, "and how civic organizations, specifically Toastmasters, helped me and can help others."

Jacob Liston joined Tri Cities Toastmasters #274 in April 2020. He has since joined several clubs in District 9 and District 10 and has served as club president, VP of Education, VP of Membership, Sergeant of Arms, and Area B2 director.

Catherine Wiberg to Present SMED Talk on Appreciative Intelligence

Dr. Catherine Wiberg will present a SMED Talk entitled, "I've heard of Emotional Intelligence. What's Appreciative Intelligence?"

Here's a synopsis: Appreciative Intelligence and Appreciative Inquiry have been around since the 1980s, but not many people seem to know what they are. Are they the "attitude of gratitude" that so many people encourage? Although that's a good start, appreciative intelligence is significantly more than that.
