District 9 has had a successful year. As I write this, we are No. 1 in the region for new clubs and No. 2 for membership growth, while being well into the top third of districts internationally,





'Fellow Toastmasters wouldn't allow me to quit!' Lynette Charity Tells Her Story

[Editor's note: After representing District 9 as 2013's District International Speech Contest champion and competing in the World Championship of Public Speaking at the 2013 Toastmasters International Convention in Cincinnati, OH, Lynette is on her way back to the World Championship (this time in Kuala Lumpur, Malyasia), having again won the District contest. Her winning speech this year is entitled "Click Three Times" and has a Wizard of Oz theme.]



I joined Toastmasters in December 2012. I had completed the obligatory six speeches prior to competing and received my Competent Communicator award just before the World Championship.

Prior to the BIG stage, I had given my speeches to

local Toastmasters Club groups of up to 12 people. I was not prepared for the experience I had in Cincinnati. I was quite nervous, but when I took the stage as the last contestant in my group of nine, I knew I had a "winning" speech. I was quite confident, almost too much so.

My deliveries of my speech to the various clubs were consistently timed at 6:45. However, when I began my speech at the World Championship, I lost track of time.

The audience and I "connected," and with at least 200 people present, the interaction and laughter ate away my "cushion."

At one point, an audience member made a comment, and I momentarily "forgot" my speech. More time lost. When I concluded, I knew that I had given a winning speech and was uppleasantly surprised at my time disqualification:

has been delayed until mid-2015.



Every time we put the Toastmasters name and our local club information in front of the community, we insert a tickler in the minds of those who are already considering Toastmasters and raise the awareness of those unfamiliar with our organization. Yes, it's much easier to get items like these published in small, community publications than in our more urban areas, but we need to keep trying to get the word out.

I am also proud of the progress we've made in improving the Web presence of our community clubs and ensuring that their Web presence is accurate on the Toastmasters.org site. In my year as Lt. Gov. Marketing, I will continue promoting the goal of a Web presence for every community club. Need help
