

Greg Szabo took speech classes in college in Illinois, but "never got over the nerves," he says. Greg, a member of the Vision Speaks Toastmasters club at





Inland Northwest Lighthouse for the Blind in Spokane, credits his Toastmasters experience with his being named one of two Lighthouse for the Blind Employees of the Year. Required to give a speech as part of the Employee of the Year competition process in Seattle, Greg says he still felt the nerves but got over them and felt he was "in the zone" during the speech.



Greg, who was born with retinitis pigmentosa and developed severe eyesight problems at age 22, also had

the benefit of having practiced his Employee of the Year speech at Vision Speaks and obtaining feedback from club members. At the Seattle competition, he says, he "felt comfortable in front of the group – the most comfortable I've ever felt." The audience in Seattle praised his speech, suggesting the talk clinched his Employee of the Year honor.

Greg has been a senior production worker at Inland Northwest Lighthouse in Spokane for a year and a half and a member of Vision Speaks since June 2012. He was one of four employees nominated for Inland Northwest Lighthouse at the Spokane facility and also had to give a "pitch" there before being chosen to go on to the Seattle event. Greg and his co-winner, Larry Irvin, will next attend the National Industries for the Blind (NIB) National Conference in Maryland, where he will compete for the Peter J. Salmon award, which honors employees who excel in their positions at NIB associated agencies. Greg is unsure whether that competition will include a speech, but he is prepared for the possibility.



As noted in an article about Greg's honor in Lighthouse's publication <u>Horizons</u>, Greg enjoys playing and coaching goalball, a team sport designed

### Success Idea of the Month: Back in the September 2012

<u>newsletter</u>, we noted Division D Governor Frank Briggs's High-Performance Leadership project in progress – a plan to hold a "mega-meeting" involving multiple clubs. Clubs in the Yakima area have provided a successful model of such a meeting with their recent Leadership Workshop. District Secretary Debra Kroon Yates reports:

"Last fall, with the announcement about Leadership Workshops coming up for January/February, I realized that this would be a great opportunity for our clubs in Yakima for a couple of reasons:

says the most important person in Toastmasters is the individual member. If that's true, you might ask, "Is there a second most important person?" It turns out, according to Toastmasters, there is: the Area Governor.

Area Governors are the key to knitting our far-flung individual clubs into a



mutually supportive network of Toastmasters. They help us have clubs with unique character and heritage at the same time they share the culture and values of Toastmasters at large.

Have you ever traveled somewhere well away from your home and visited a club in that area. It can be a delightful experience. There is much that is familiar, enough to make you feel comfortable and nearly at home, but a few things that are different and interesting. Area Governors can play an important role in helping maintain this consistency while encouraging clubs to develop their own identity.

Area Governors can supply an outside eye to help your club recognize what it is doing well and areas in which it can improve. In effect, they serve their clubs as an evaluator, providing feedback clubs can use, or not, as they see fit. They also serve as conduits of information between their clubs and the district and can help connect clubs to District resources such as club coaches and resources that can help clubs grow and thrive.

#### Area Governors are also

responsible for organizing area speech contests twice a year and they work with Division Governors to plan and conduct club-officer training.

For me, being an Area Governor was the most challenging and fun position I've held in Toastmasters. There was plenty of opportunity for growth coupled with the chance to get to know and work with The majority of the clubs have small membership; we have a new Advanced Club that was formed last July. One of the intents of the Advanced Club was to be available to help with these types of leadership events.

"I suggested we take our February meeting [of the Advanced Club Audible Experience, which meets monthly], invite all clubs that wanted to participate, help out, and market their clubs to join us. It was advertised as a one-day (two-hour) workshop. Our Toastmaster, Cathy Simon, arranged for four excellent, prepared presenters whose speeches/presentations would appeal to the community. All were given manual credit or used the event as a forum to present those longer required projects, such as those from the Better Speaker series. We also used the Competent Leader manual to ensure those members that were involved got their credit.

"District leadership got us coverage in the local paper and on the radio station. We had 15 guests attend. We had contact from others who were unable to attend. Overall, it was a great success. I recommend this method quite heartily."

Needed are 200+ community judges. Investment of time, as you provide feedback to these young speakers, is all that's needed.

More from Esther Paul, NCFCA Region II Coordinator: "As a thankyou, we provide our judges with complimentary meals and refreshments while they serve. Judging each round is a three-hour commitment that includes a brief judge orientation. You may judge as few as one round on one day, or as many as several rounds over all three days."

To sign yourself up, please go to the <u>Judges Registration section of</u> <u>the NCFCA website</u>. From there, you'll select our region on a map, and can choose "Inland Northwest Qualifier." Then you can select your judge slots and receive an email confirmation. You'll receive another reminder a few days before the event. Toastmasters beyond my local club. Being an Area Governor was also my first serious opportunity to learn about the world of Toastmasters in the District and beyond.

Over the next few weeks our current Area Governors and others will begin, if they haven't already, to recruit next year's Area Governors. If you're interested, please let them know. If you're approached, please seriously consider it.
